We'll conclude on December 19th with "Hope in Unexpected Places," reflecting on Mary's song and discovering how God brings hope through surprising channels.

Each evening includes engaging video content, thoughtful discussion, and practical applications for daily life. Through prayer practices and interactive activities, we'll connect ancient wisdom to contemporary challenges. You'll receive take-home materials to continue your reflection throughout the week, helping bridge our Thursday gatherings with Sunday worship.

Whether you can attend one session or all four, you're welcome to join this journey of hope. Bring your Bible and an open heart as we make room for hope together this Advent season.

This brief yet powerful time of prayer will set a positive tone for your day, bringing peace and clarity. Whether at home or commuting, take a moment to pause, pray, and praise. 


Join Us for Books, Fellowship & Discussion




Light Up a Child's Christmas at CAMP YDP!



Celebrating the Season Together


